ABOUT THE SUMMIT

The Summit foresees two days of an exceptional and forward-thinking agenda, which includes parallel tracks addressing the impact of climate change on health, the role of the community in building resilience during strenuous times, and the importance of innovative technologies when access to healthcare is under threat, amongst others. It will enable discussions on major One Health challenges, as well as sharing data and policy developments. Above all, it will provide a great opportunity to look at public health through the patient's lens. Through an open call for posters, patient organizations will get the opportunity to present their work at one of the biggest patient-centric summits in the Asia Pacific region.

THE PARTICIPANTS

Building on the success of the 1st International Patient Summit in 2023, it will bring together stakeholders from across the Asia-Pacific region, from patient advocates, policymakers, civil society organizations, industry leaders, and experts from around the world.

CALL FOR POSTERS

As part of our two-day event themed "**Health**, **Climate**, **Community**: **Uniting Stakeholders for Action**", we are excited to announce a Poster Competition exclusively for patient organizations. This competition provides a platform for organizations to showcase their successful advocacy projects that have made a significant impact on addressing health issues in their region.

Theme: Share a successful advocacy project undertaken by your organization that addresses health issues.

Eligibility: Open to all patient organizations dedicated to improving health outcomes in the face of climate change.

Submission Fee: None.

Mode: Online submissions.

Awards: The top TWO winners of the competition will be awarded prestigious, fully funded SPEAKER SLOTS at our event, providing an opportunity to present their advocacy projects to a wider audience of multistakeholders in the Asia-Pacific Region.

SUBMISSION GUIDELINES

- All posters should be submitted via email to patientsummit@pairacademy.org. We will accept only one poster per organization.
- The deadline for poster submissions is December 2024. This deadline will not be extended.
- Registering for the event is compulsory to be able to submit the poster.
 There are no submission fees.
- All posters must be in English. It is the author's responsibility to submit a correct poster and any errors in spelling, grammar, or scientific fact in the poster will result in a deduction of points.
- Posters should not include libelous content. The material presented should not violate any copyright laws. If figures/ graphics/images have been taken from sources not copyrighted by the author, it is the author's sole responsibility to secure the rights from the copyright holder in writing, to reproduce those figures/graphics/ images for both worldwide print and web publication. All reproduction costs charged by the copyright holder must be borne by the author.
- The posters should not include mentions of activities not conducted by the organization. An event where the organization was represented but did not organize will not be considered for evaluation.
- Submitted posters must not overtly endorse or recommend a specific product or service.



The following are helpful hints and frequently asked questions regarding poster submissions for IPS 2

Q- Does the advocacy project need to be related to climate change?

A- No, the project does not need to be related to climate change. However, projects that address health issues exacerbated by climate change may receive extra consideration during the judging process.

Q- What should be included in the poster?

A- The poster should include the title of the project, the organization's name and logo, a description of the project (including objectives, methodology, and outcomes), visual elements (such as graphs, charts, or images), and contact details for further information.

Q- In what format should the posters be submitted?

A- Posters should be submitted in digital format, such as PDF, JPEG, or PNG files. The design should adhere to A1 size dimensions (841mm x 594mm).

Q- What are the judging criteria for the competition?

A- Posters will be judged based on relevance to the theme, impact of the project, innovation in approach, and presentation quality. Projects related to climate-induced health challenges may receive additional recognition.

Q- Can we submit a poster that was previously presented at another event?


A- Yes, you may submit a poster that was previously presented, as long as it aligns with the competition's theme and guidelines.

Q- How will I know if my poster has been selected as a winner?

A- Winners will be notified via email by [Insert Date]. Additionally, the results will be announced on the event website and social media channels.

Q- Can I update or revise my poster after submission?

A- No, once a poster has been submitted, no further changes or updates can be made. Please ensure that the final version is submitted.
